## JUNIPERUS

Conifer Shrub : Evergreen

*Junipers are very useful evergreen conifers for sunny positions and most soils, provided they are not waterlogged. They range from prostrate, through semi-ascending to fastigate forms. Varieties are available with golden, grey, green, blue or variegated foliage. In recent years a disease causing severe browning of the foliage has caused problems with, in particular, Juniperus horizontalis types. As a result, these varieties are not offered.*
